Kindergarten—Faith Page




Scripture Passage: Six days of Creation Genesis 1:1-31

This was the third day. Then God said, "Let there be lights in the sky to separate day from night." So God made the two large lights. He made the brighter light to rule the day. He made the smaller light to rule the night. He also made the stars. God saw that all these things were good. Evening passed, and morning came. This was the fourth day. Then God said, "Let the water be filled with living things. And let birds fly in the air above the earth." So God created the large sea animals. God also made every bird that flies. God blessed them and said, "Have many young ones and grow in number. Fill the water of the seas, and let the birds grow in number on the earth." Evening passed, and morning came. This was the fifth day. Then God said, "Let the earth be filled with animals. And let each produce more of its own kind. Let there be tame animals and small crawling animals and wild animals. And let each produce more of its kind." And it happened. Then God said, "Let us make human beings in our image and likeness." So God created human beings in his image. God blessed them and said, "Have many children and grow in number. Rule over every living thing that moves on the earth." And it happened. God looked at everything he had made, and it was very good. Evening passed, and morning came. This was the sixth day.

Reflection

Kindergarten have been completing the Religious Education unit 'God is our creator'. In this unit, students develop their appreciation for the wonders and beauty God has bestowed upon us through His creation. Students explored the story 'Six Days of Creation' to enjoy, appreciate and celebrate aspects of the natural world around them. Kindergarten are developing their role as a Steward of Creation and doing their best to look after God's marvels. We attended Stage 2's Art Gallery to understand how we can help save our environment and grew herbs in the classroom to learn how to be responsible to help God's creation survive.



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Mercy Celebrations

Last week Mrs Clogher and I attended the Mercy Day Mass to celebrate a woman of true mercy - Catherine McAuley. Catherine established the House of Mercy in Dublin, where she provided educational, religious and social services for women and children at risk of homelessness through poverty and exploitation.

In his homily, Fr Walter spoke about how Christ's mission was to show the mercy that has been shown to us: *'Jesus affirms that mercy is not only an action of the Father, it becomes a criterion for ascertaining who his true children are. In short, we are called to show mercy because mercy has first been shown to us. As the Father loves, so do his children. Just as he is merciful, so we are called to be merciful to each other – called to become 'instruments of mercy' in our world, our community and all our relationships.'*

Pope Francis reminds us that *'mercy is the best thing we can feel: it changes the world...changes everything...makes the world less cold and more just'*

As a community of disciples, we at Sacred Heart are called to action mercy. Let us see the face of God in those we encounter, extending the model of mercy Jesus showed us. Let us be warm not only to our friends, but also those who challenge us. Let us be gentle in words and actions to all those we encounter. After all, we are all God's people.

QUESTION: Who has fish?


Bonus: Determine everything you can about each person and their favourite things. I will publish the answer I got in another note. Try to answer it yourself first!
