
### Matthew 28:1-10 The Resurrection of Jesus




### **Reflection**

Stage Two is currently learning about the different recounts of the Resurrection of Jesus, linking this to death and new life in our own lives, and family experiences. This scripture passage informs us of the way Jesus fulfilled his promise to us through the Resurrection, reinforcing our belief in him and all he says and does. The disciples of Jesus experienced this challenging time, so we must also be strong and faithful during times of loss with a positive outlook towards the times to come.


