Joint Band Concert



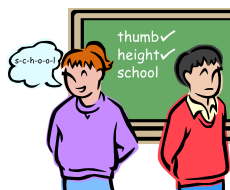

Sharing our expertise with our colleagues

Drama Literacy continues this term

This year our school goal has been to develop critical literacy skills and deep learning across all learning areas. One strategy we have used to develop the necessary skills is using drama techniques for all children to access the book at their level of understanding and to build deep learning using embodied cognition and clear communication skills. Children are able to live the story and really understand the characters, the relationships and sequence of events relevant to the story line. From this, children will experience the language structures needed to articulate and develop discourse necessary to be effective communicators.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

On Tuesday many children received the first Sacrament of Reconciliation at our Parish of Sacred Heart. I congratulate the children and wish them God's choicest blessing as they continue on their spiritual faith journey.

No further applications will be accepted after 1:00pm on Friday 21 November, 2014.

Please note: A minimum number of enrolment applications must be received by the due date for all day care to proceed – if this number is not reached, care will not be available on the pupil-free days. Families will be advised on Monday 24 November 2014 if all day is not proceeding at this service and advised of alternative COSHC locations offering all day care.
